“The daily was taken away”-Daniel 8:11; 11:30; 12:11.

Daily = “stretch, continuance, constant, constantly, regular.” While the English word “daily” is found only 7 times in the Old Testament, (5 in Daniel), the Hebrew word for daily which is “taw-meed” is used numerous times in the Bible.

The daily in the Bible

In the Torah (the first five books of the Bible), specifically in Numbers and Leviticus the “daily” or “taw-meed” (Strong’s #8548) is identified with the earthly sanctuary service.

The sacrifices for sin, incense, lamps of light, shewbread, and ministration of the priests were all identified as “daily” or “continual” (#8548) aspects of the sanctuary service.

- “...ever be burning upon the altar” Leviticus 6:13.
- “...continual burnt offering” Exodus 29:42.
- “...continual bread offering...” Numbers 4:7.
- “Aaron shall bear the names of the children of Israel... upon his heart... before the Lord continually” Exodus 28:29.
- “...lamps to burn continually” Leviticus 24:2.
- “... a perpetual incense before the Lord” Exodus 30:8.

The earthly sanctuary and its divine ordinances all pointed to Jesus as the ultimate sacrifice, incense, light, bread and priest. They were a daily to direct us to the daily—Jesus Christ.

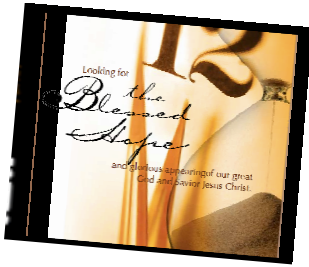
Hebrews 7:27—“Who needeth not **daily**, as those high priests, to offer sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people’s: for this He did once, when He offered up Himself.”

Ephesians 5:2—“And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given Himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a **sweet smelling savour.**”
John 1:9—“That was the true **Light**, which lightest every man that cometh into the world.”

John 6:51—“I am the living **bread**...”

Hebrews 7:24—“But this man, because He **continueth ever**, hath an unchangeable priesthood.”

The daily in the Christian experience



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The daily points us to Jesus, to His sacrifice, His forgiveness, His word, His light, His love. God is calling us back to Him, to glory in Him, to sing to Him, give thanks to Him, to make known His deeds among the people, to “seek His face **continually**”¹ 1 Chronicles 16:11.

“...let such as love thy salvation say **continually**: The Lord be magnified”
Psalm 40:16.

“His praise shall **continually** be in my mouth” Psalm 34:1.

“...let Thy lovingkindness and Thy truth **continually** preserve me” Psalm 40:11.

“Be Thou my strong habitation, whereunto I may **continually** resort” Psalm 71:3.

“So shall I keep Thy law **continually** for ever and ever” Psalm 119:44.

“My son, keep thy father’s commandment, and forsake not the law of thy mother: Bind them **continually** upon thine heart, and tie them about thy neck” Proverbs 6:21.
